The highlights of today were the Brazilian Beechjet, the first two planes in the log which are respectively almost and more than 40 years old and the Shorts, some of which are still airworthy. The position of the sun is best in the (late) afternoon for the first, midday for the second and in the morning for the third heliport (not too early, because they start operations at 9AM).

Today we visited Florida's west coast: Sarasota and surroundings. While the other family members visited the Ringling museum, I walked about a mile to the airport and found a nice spotting hill on the right side of the terminal, which is located on the south side of the airport. There are some roofed benches here, so you can sit in the shadow. You can photograph over the fence, especially when you're standing on the benches. Light is good from late morning till sunset, depending on how the aircraft are taxiing to/from the gate. You can also photograph the aircraft that are landing and departing runway 32. At Sarasota Airport there are two runways, 14-32 (the longer one) and 04-22 (the shorter one). Generally speaking, most small GA planes will take the shorter runway and the airliners will take the longer runway, however during my visit a CRJ also landed on the shorter runway.

The above planes were seen in about one hour that I spent at the airport.

In the afternoon we visited this small but interesting heliport. Besides the Bayflight rescue helicopter that visits here now and then (not today), United Helicopter is based here. This company performs maintenance, repair and overhaul on Hiller helicopters. Unfortunately none of the helicopters were outside, but we got a nice little tour inside the hangar. The tour guide (probably the boss) told us that the employees work from early morning till about 3.30 PM, which might explain why there were no helicopters outside when we arrived at 4 PM.

The civil registration of the military colored Hiller was not worn on the outside, but I found it on the internet. Apparently this helicopter crashed earlier this year and is now rebuilt and painted in its original colors.

As is mentioned on their website, the heliport is not always easy to find as some GPS systems (including ours) have a problem locating the address. From Highway 75 take

exit 210, then drive westwards on Fruitville Rd, turn left on Cattlemen Rd, the left again on Palmer Blvd, pass underneath the highway and turn left on Center Road.

This little airport is located just northwest of the town of Titusville. There is a Skydive Center located here, one King Air was flying and one was inside the hangar. N21DZ still wears its former military color scheme. The skydive center is located on the east side of the runway, so the light is good here in the morning and early afternoon, depending on how the plane is taxiing. The pilot might be willing to take you up for a ride as an observer; this would cost you 70 dollars (which isn't very expensive in my opinion if you want to fly in a King Air).

I don't think I've ever seen so many choppers on a single airport! Space Coast Regional Airport is home to the Bristow Academy, which has no less than 58 helicopters based here. A fair amount of them was seen parked on the apron or hovering around. Bristow Academy is located on the east side of the main runway, so photography is best in the morning or early afternoon. The fence is rather high though, so it might be a good idea to ask at the flight school if it's possible to take photos on airside. With clouds and thunderstorms approaching, we decided not to do that.

On the northeast side of the airport the Valiant Air Command Museum is located. We didn't visit the museum but noted two aircraft from the outside.

The skydive center is a spotting friendly place. Besides the PAC 750 they also have a Skyvan and a Twin Otter, but those did not fly this day. A real shame, because the skydive center offers observation flights for only 33 dollars in their twins...

On this day we paid two visits to the airport of Daytona. In the morning we had a look at the Embry Riddle Aeronautical University (ERAU), which is located adjacent to the airport and in the afternoon we made a quick tour around the field.

Daytona Beach has three runways, two roughly east-west and one roughly north-south oriented. The main runway is 07L-25R, the other two are only used by small single-engine GA airplanes.

If runway 25R is in use, you can photograph the landing and departing planes on both the north side (ERAU has a terrace on top of one of its buildings, but I don't know if this is accessible to non-students) and the south side (Aviation Center Parkway).

If runway 07L is in use, you can park your car and stand along Midway Avenue on the north side of the runway. Light is good here in the late afternoon and evening. You can photograph both landing and departing planes, as well as planes on the taxiway.

There are also a few good photo points along the various aprons. Be aware that you need stairs at most places.

The Convair is stored near the control tower, at Bellevue Avenue Ext on the southside of the main runway.

The former USAF Learjet can be found at the ERAU campus.

Traffic comprises mainly of (large and small) general aviation, especially when there is a racing event at the Daytona International Speedway, located next to the airport. There's also a limited amount of scheduled airline services (Delta and US Airways).

Before we returned our rental car, we visited the B-52 and the Cessna Citation Service Center (see Scramble Airfield Guide). The B-52 can be photographed best in the late afternoon/evening. At the Citation Center, it should be OK to stop for a couple of minutes and read the aircraft on the apron, but I don't think they'll be very happy when you get your camera and stairs out.

While waiting for our flight Delta 2028 (N532US, B757-200) I did some spotting from the terminal.

Our last stop in America was Detroit. The above was read while waiting for flight Delta 234 (N801NW, A330-300) to Amsterdam and while taxiing towards the runway.

All in all I had a very nice holiday with over 300 new aircraft logged. The number of photos however, was quite a bit less than expected (and hoped). Photo conditions in Florida during mid-summer are not ideal for a number of reasons:

^{*}it was very hot (and humid), so heathaze are a big problem if you're not close to the action;

- *especially during midday the sun is right on top of you, so the bottom half of the aircraft is shaded;
- *days are shorter than in northwestern Europe (it was already dark by 8PM), with a rapid sunrise and sunset;
- *every afternoon it was overcast with showers and thunderstorms, after which the skies failed to clear up.

So if you'd like to go to Florida, I suggest you go between September and May (which should also be the dry season).
