The runways lie end-to-end but separated from each other, which means that the airport area is very large. The civil apron is located southeast, while in the centre and west the military is situated. On the civil side, Zaragoza is just a modest airport with a little bit of GA, some low-cost flights and some domestic flights. Every now and then a freighter visits the airport.
